The Rockefeller Foundation invites applications for its residencies for academic writing and for arts and literary arts. The Bellagio residency program offers residencies to provide time for critical thinking, disciplined work, individual reflection, and collegial engagement, uninterrupted by the usual professional and personal demands. The following types of residencies are available:

- academic writing residencies offer one-month residencies for up to residents at a time. Individuals based at a university or think tank in any discipline and from any part of the world are welcome to apply. The center maintains a core focus on projects consistent with the foundation’s mission to expand opportunities for poor or vulnerable people and to help see that the benefits of globalization are shared more widely. It also seeks to include beyond that core a wide variety of projects from all academic disciplines;
- arts and literary arts residencies support composers, fiction and non-fiction writers, playwrights, poets, video/filmmakers and visual artists provide time for disciplined work, individual reflection, and collegial engagement, uninterrupted by the usual professional and personal demands. The center typically offers

one-month stays for three to five creative artists at a time. Artists of significant achievement from any country are welcome to apply.

## **H**IGH PRIORITY, SHORT-TERM BRIDGE AWARD

*Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation International*

## **J** **JOINT RESEARCH PROJECT GRANTS** *Third World Network of Scientific Organisations*

### **Description:**

The Third World Network of Scientific Organizations invites applications for its joint research project grants. These encourage and support joint research projects involving two to three competent research and training institutions from different countries in the South. The grants provide support for

research projects in both basic and applied fields, including:

The International Association for Bear Research and Management invites applications for its research and conservation grants. These grants are intended to support bear conservation, education projects and research. Proposals may be used for the following:

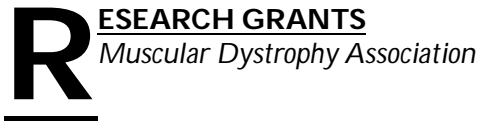

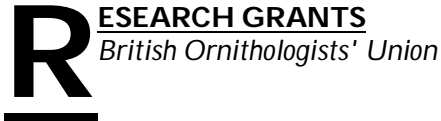
