*NIH: National Institutes of Health*

**Description:**

The National Institutes of Health, through its roadmap initiative, has issued a solicitation of assays for high throughput screening in the molecular libraries probe production centers network. The NIH molecular libraries roadmap initiative wishes to solicit HTS assay applications from the scientific community from investigators who have the interest and capability to work with the molecular libraries probe production centers network in support of chemical probe development. ## **I** **NNOVATION FOR HIV VACCINE DISCOVERY (R01)** *NIH: National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases*

**Description:**

The National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases invites applications for its innovation for HIV vaccine discovery grants. This R01 funding opportunity announcement encourages applications from institutions and organizations proposing innovative, high risk, high impact research to identify novel vaccine concepts and targets that will aid in the design and development of an effective immunogen to provide long-term protection from acquisition of HIV. The emphasis is on early discovery research that incorporates new ideas leading to the development of new conventional or outside-the-box approaches for HIV vaccines. Applicants must clearly state how their proposed new idea, approach and rationale:

- offers a potential solution for preventing acquisition of infection;
- could be stringently tested and potentially implemented;
- differs from current or previously failed approaches;
- will contribute, inform, or provide more than incremental knowledge to the field regardless of the outcome.

NIAID intends to commit \$3 million in total costs to fund five to 10 awards in fiscal year 2012. The total project period for an application cannot exceed four years. Application budgets are limited to \$350,000
