PHD FELLOWSHIPS Boehringer Ingelheim Fund

Description:

Boehringer Ingelheim Fonds invites applications for its PhD fellowships. These support basic biomedical research conducted by scientists not older than 27 years in an internationally leading laboratory in Europe. The research should be aimed at elucidating basic biological phenomena of human life and acquiring new scientific knowledge. Applicants will hold a diploma or equivalent degree and have passed their state examinations when applicable. At the deadline, applicants should not have worked on their project for longer than six months. Applicants should be European citizens working in Europe or overseas or non-European citizens pursuing their PhD project in Europe. Scholarships are granted for at least two years, with the option of renewal for a further 12 months. The basic monthly grant is worth €1,550. In most countries scholars are paid an additional €150 per month to cover minor project-related costs such as books and travelling expenses and premiums for personal insurance. A separate country-related premium is added and spouse or child allowance may be available.

P OSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIPS *Canadian Institutes of Health Research*

Description:

The Canadian Institutes of Health Research invites applications for their postdoctoral fellowship programme. Fellowships provide support for highly qualified candidates at the post-PhD or post-health professional degree stages to add to their experience by engaging in health research either in Canada or abroad. For this competition, applications will be accepted in all areas of health research. It is anticipated that approximately \$21 million

over five years will be available for this competition.

The maximum amount awarded for a single award is \$60,000 for up to five years. The value and duration of each fellowship is related to the major degree held, licensure (where applicable), location of tenure and experience of the applicant. The research allowance is \$5,000 per annum.

At the time of application, a candidate must hold, or be completing a PhD or a health professional degree (or equivalent). The health professional degree must be in a regulated health profession which requires at least a bachelor's degree to be eligible for licensure in Canada. For individuals that do not hold a health professional degree, awards will take effect only after the recipient has completed all requirements of the PhD program, including the oral examination. Candidates with more than three years of post-PhD research training by the competition deadline are not eligible to apply for this award. Candidates with a health professional degree may propose a program of research leading to a Master's or PhD degree; however, registration in a graduate degree program is not a requirement. These awards are normally held at Canadian institutions; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents may apply for awards to be held outside Canada. Candidates who are neither Canadian citizens nor permanent residents may apply for awards to be held in Canada only.

R ESEARCH ASSOCIATESHIP PROGRAMS: FAA/CIVIL AEROSPACE MEDICAL INSTITUTE *National Research Council*

Description:

The National Research Council invites applications for its research associateship programs at the FAA/Civil Aerospace Medical Institute. The objectives of the programs are to provide postdoctoral scientists and engineers of unusual promise and ability with opportunities for research on problems, largely of their own choice, that are compatible with the interests of the sponsoring laboratories.

Awardees must hold a PhD, ScD, or other earned research doctoral degree recognized in US academic circles as equivalent to a PhD. 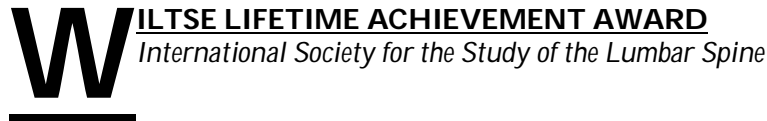

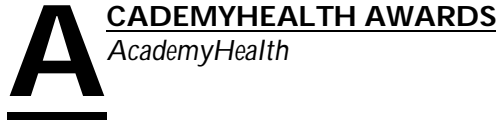

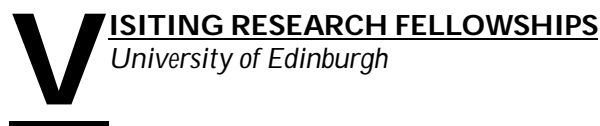
