# **A** MAROUT FELLOWSHIPS Madrid Institute for Advanced Studies

## **Description:**

The Madrid Institute for Advanced Studies invites proposals for its AMAROUT fellowships. These enable experienced and very experienced investigators from any country to conduct research at any of the eight IMDEA institutes participating in the programme. These institutes cover software, energy, food, materials, nanoscience, networks, water and social science. Experienced fellows must have a doctorate and at least four years' full time research experience, and receive an average salary of €48,775. Very experienced fellows must occupy a research leadership position, such as professor, have more than 10 years' experience, and receive an average salary of €76,667. Incoming fellows must be non-nationals and non-residents of member states or associated countries. Reintegration fellows must be member state or associated country nationals who have carried out research in a third country for at least three years. Fellowships last for one year, with the possibility of renewal. For this call, 20 awards are available for experienced researchers and 10 awards for very experienced researchers.
