The Netherlands Organisation for Scientific Research invites applications for its rubicon grants. The aim of the rubicon programme is to encourage talented researchers at Dutch universities and research institutes run by KNAW and NWO to dedicate themselves to careers in postdoctoral research. Rubicon offers researchers who have completed their doctorates in the past year the chance to gain

experience at a top research institution outside the Netherlands. The rubicon programme also offers talented researchers from abroad the opportunity to obtain grants to spend a maximum of two years conducting research in the Netherlands.
