JWT JONES TRAVELLING FELLOWSHIP

Royal Society of Chemistry

Description:

The Royal Society of Chemistry invites applications for the JWT Jones travelling fellowship. These enable younger chemists to carry out short-term studies in well-established scientific centres abroad and to learn and use techniques not accessible to them in their own country. Candidates must be members of the society for at least one year and should be under 45 years of age. They must hold at least a doctorate in chemistry or a related subject and should already be in post and actively engaged in independent research. Applicants are required to return to their country of origin upon termination of the fellowship so that the applicant's home country may benefit from the broadened knowledge acquired during the fellowship. Awards are worth a maximum of £5,000 over one to three months to cover travel and subsistence.

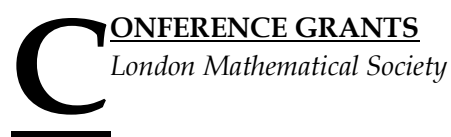
