## **J**ESSUP AND MCHENRY AWARDS

### **Description:**

The Academy of Natural Sciences invites applications for the Jessup and McHenry awards. Jessup funds are awarded competitively to students wishing to conduct research projects at the postgraduate, doctoral and postdoctoral levels. Such studies may be in any specialty in which curators have expertise. The McHenry fund is similarly intended, but is restricted to botanists. Awards are restricted to those who wish to conduct their study at the academy. The minimum duration of an award is two weeks; the maximum is 16 weeks. The stipend for subsistence is \$375 per week. Round-trip travel costs up to a total of \$500 for North American applicants, including Mexico and the Caribbean, and \$1,000 for applicants from other parts of the world may be available.
