## **J**OHAN F PERKINS JR MEMORIAL AWARD FOR INTERNATIONAL PHYSIOLOGISTS *American Physiological Society*

### **Description:**

The American Physiological Society invites applications for the John F Perkins Jr memorial award for international physiologists. The award promotes cultural exchange and scientific collaborations by providing supplementary aid to families of foreign scientists working for a minimum of three months in the US. In this way, young scientists are able to bring their families and thus make full use of the cultural exchange as well as the scientific benefits associated with an international collaboration. The award will support family visits to the US for postdoctoral fellows and junior faculty from overseas.

The program presupposes that the visiting scientist and their host already have made arrangements for scientific collaboration and have sufficient funds to cover the needs of the visiting scientist. The application must be made jointly by the host and the visiting scientist. The host must be an APS member.

The recipient receives funds generally not exceeding US\$5,000.

## **I**INTERNATIONAL GEOSCIENCE PROGRAMME YOUNG SCIENTIST PROJECTS UNESCO

### Description:

Unesco invites applications for funding from its international geoscience programme young scientist project grants. These foster international cooperation between prospective young scientists from developing and developed countries early in their careers. Priority areas are:

- geoscience of the water cycle;
- geohazards - mitigating the risks;
- Earth resources - sustaining our society;
- global change and evolution of life - evidence from the geological record;
- the deep Earth - how it controls our environment.

Applicants should have completed their PhD within the last 10 years and must demonstrate an affiliation to a research institute, university, geological survey or equivalent organisation for the duration of the project. Projects should involve at least three young scientists from a minimum of two countries. The principal proposer must be from a developing country. Funding worth between US\$5,000 and US\$10,000 per year is available for a maximum of three years. Grants may support field meetings, travel to international conferences, participation in training courses and the purchase of research equipment.

**C** REATIVE AND NOVEL IDEAS IN HIV RESEARCH (CNIHR)  
*International Aids Society*

**Description:**

The International Aids Society invites proposals for creative and novel ideas in HIV research (CNIHR). The aim of this

programme is to attract international and US-based early-stage investigators from outside the field of HIV, as well as researchers involved in other aspects of HIV/Aids

research, to help address key scientific questions on research towards a cure. Research topics could include any aspect of science relating to research towards a cure. Projects may not include prospective human interventional trials, although studies of animal models, stored samples from existing cohorts, small pathogenic studies or in vitro trials are permitted. Junior investigators who have completed their terminal research degree or medical residency within the last 10 years and who hold a faculty or equivalent position at an academic institution, or a comparable position in a not-for-profit organisation or research institution, are eligible to apply. Postdoctoral trainees who have completed their training and will have a faculty or comparable position prior to the deadline for full proposals may also apply. Applicants may not yet have been engaged in research towards a cure. Funding is worth up to US\$150,000 in direct costs, plus applicable indirect costs, per year for one or two years. Each grantee and their mentor will also receive support to attend conferences convened by the society during their award period.

## **I** INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGES SCHEME *Royal Society*

### **Description:**

The Royal Society invites applications for its international exchanges scheme. This offers a flexible platform for UK-based scientists to interact with the best scientists around the world. Funds contribute towards travel, subsistence and research expenses, and can

be requested for either a one-off short visit in order to explore opportunities for building lasting networks or for bilateral visits to strengthen emerging collaborations. Activities must be on a subject within the natural sciences, including physics, chemistry, mathematics, computer science,

engineering, agricultural and medical research, and scientific aspects of archaeology, geography and experimental psychology, but excluding social science, and clinical or patient-oriented research. Applicants must have a PhD or equivalent research experience and hold a permanent or fixed-term contract in an eligible university or research institute for the duration of the project. Collaborations should be based on a single project involving the UK-based scientist and the overseas-based scientist. Collaborations with any country outside the UK are eligible for this scheme. Applicants may request:

- up to £3,000 for one-off travel lasting up to three months;
- up to £6,000 for multiple visits to be completed within one year, including a maximum of £1,000 for research expenses;
- up to £12,000 for multiple visits to be completed within two years, including a maximum of £2,000 for research expenses.
